Faculties and Schools: The Uganda Pentecostal University is made up of six faculties—Law, Business Administration, Journalism and Communication Sciences, Education, Social Sciences and Development Studies. The six faculties oversee departments and divisions that offer courses leading to the award of academic degrees, diplomas and certificates in different disciplines.

Campus: The main campus is located at Kahungabunyonyi in Fort Portal Municipality, Kabarole District. The university also has study centres in Kampala and Kamwenge.

Commencement: Opened its gates in March 2001 with eight students and granted a license from National Council for Higher Education in August 2005.

History: Has maintained a steady growth since its inception with eight students in 2001 to over 1,700 today and still going strong. On February 24, 2017, the university held its 12th congregation.

Student Life: An enjoyable atmosphere. As our motto indicates, students are free to do all reasonable acts and deeds and to ensure they grow up as responsible citizens.

Community benefits: We work hand in hand with districts and kingdoms to offer scholarships and bursaries to deserving students. Students from the kingdoms of Toro, Bunyoro, Ankole, Alur,

Lango, Acholi, Obusinga bwa Rwenzururu and Obudhingiya bwa Bwamba have benefitted from the University bursary scheme.

Community relations

The university has established links with kingdoms of Toro, Bunyoro, and Rwenzururu including signed agreements with the cultural chiefs of the Alur, Acholi Obudhingiya bwa Bamba and Lango. We have also extended bursaries to district administrations of Ibanda, Kiruhura, Mbarara, Sheema, Igara, Buhweju, Lwengo, Kanungu and Rukungiri. Other districts that are interested in having students from their areas benefit from this scheme can get in touch with the university administration.

UPU bases its courses on job creation, not job seeking. The courses offered lead to self-employment such as Law, Journalism, Information Technology and Business Administration. The university is also conscious of the social needs to promote education and it trains teachers at subsidized rates.

Future prospects

The university aims at maintaining a small student-teacher ratio in the belief that a student should have time and opportunity to interact with instructors even outside the lecture room.

Freedom of worship

UPU is a truly Christian university. However, it allows students freedom to worship in their respective beliefs. The university has a strong Pentecostal community vibrant Anglican Chaplaincy, Catholic Chaplaincy, and the Muslim community reflected among both student and staff populations.

Fees payments

The University has flexible fees payment structure. "Students are allowed to pay fees in installments and students with bursaries pay half of the tuition. In addition, there are annual payments (administrative fees) that are compulsory for all the students whether on bursary or private sponsorship.

QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates who have attained the minimum of two principal passes at UACE obtained at the same sitting or its equivalent in relevant subjects or holding a relevant diploma or A pass in mature age entry examinations with at least 50% and must be 25 years and above. The mature age entry examinations must have been accredited by the National Council for Higher Education are invited to apply for degree programmes in the courses hereunder. Candidates who have attained one principal pass or equivalent in relevant subjects may apply for diploma programmes. For certificate courses, candidates must have attained a minimum of three credits at UCE.

CANDIDATES FROM OUTSIDE UGANDA: Bridging course for students who have done their secondary education outside Uganda. The bridging courses must have been accredited by the National Council for Higher Education.
