



Youth and Income in the Acholi Region

This was a 3 year project spread across Northern Uganda seeking to give 4,600 young people the skills they require to get employment or to be self employed entrepreneurs. Carried out in partnership with the Christian Counselling Fellowship (CCF), Pader, the project resulted in 1000 youth gaining employment and 600 starting income generating activities with their local communities. Youth sports competitions were used to bring young people together and hence enthuse others to join.

Skills to last a lifetime!

The project worked with 4 vocational training institutes to provide training and local businesses to give apprenticeship and coaching opportunities. Young people presenting business plans were provided with start up kits including goats, pigs, sewing machines, bee-hives and one group, made up of school drop-outs, was given a rice huller. Youth with disabilities were given special support to enable them to access the training, such as Okot Dickens tricycle chair (pictured).

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
