NCHE gets multi-billion shillings home

fter 13 renting a small four-room house at Kvambogo University,

National Council for Higher Education (NCHE) recently entered their new home in Ntinda, a Kampala suburb.

The imposing multibillion building no doubt befits the status of NCHE, whose major role is to regulate higher education in the country.

"We did not have the moral authority to ask for certain standards of infrastructure from the institutions that we supervise when we ourselves do not meet those standards. But now, we can talk without fear, Prof. Opuda Asibo, the

executive director of NCHE,

says.
"Coming here is not for luxury; we had to move for effective service delivery. Prior to coming here, we did not have space for our staff, our boardroom was in a tent outside and our canteen was under a mango tree, the building was not befitting of an institution of our stature, but never the less, we carried on our duties well because we were committed to our work," Opuda adds.

The complex cost the higher education regulator sh5.3b to set up and the construction was done by China Nanjing Uganda Limited.

The complex was entirely built using locally sourced funds mobilised by the NCHE, but we have asked the Government to come to our aid in completing the construction, with sh2b,

The complex has spacious

offices, a council room, boardroom and conference hall, which can accommodate up to 100 people. It also has modern lavatories, kitchen,

canteen and a perimeter wall.
According to Opuda, the new offices will greatly improve service delivery. "We expect to accomplish a lot because of a conducive environment; we are also installing a computerised data centre which will have information about all the higher institutions of learning in the country," Opuda says.

The new offices will enable

the Council to meet its mission of setting standards and regulations to ensure that all public and private tertiary education institutions in Uganda create, sustain and provide relevant and quality higher education for all qualified Ugandans and to meet the local, national and global higher education challenges of the future.
