- 1. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs successfully coordinated the historic visit of pope Francis (27th-29th, Nov.2015))
- 2. H.E the President of the Republic of Uganda together with UN Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon and the Prime Minister of Denmark Lars Lokke Rasmussen successfully co-chaired the high level summit on the launch of the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable
- The president of the general Assembly promoted key high level priorities of interest to Africa including combating climate change peaceful settlement of conflicts advancing of gender equality and empowerment of women, revitalization of UNGA and reforms of the security council.
- Hon.Sam Kutesa.as the president of the general assembly, successfully steered the "Third International Conference on Financing for Development "in Addis Ababa-Ethiopia
- The 69th Session of UNGA, which Hon, Kutesa presided over set the Agenda for the Paris Climate Change Conference. During this conference the Paris Agreement on Climate Change was adopted. This represents an historic opportunity to put the world on course to meet climate change challenges.

- Within the International Conference of the Great Lakes Region Uganda continues to support efforts geared towards addressing peace, security and stability in Fastern DRC
