- Completed construction of 16 valley tanks in Kaabong (6), Nakapiripirit (5) and Abim (5) Districts.
- 3,250 ox-ploughs procured and delivered
- 4,000 Oxen procured and distributed. 1,630 goats procured and distributed, delivery of 500 improved he-goats for
- farmers is ongoing.

 Trained 80 livestock farmers and 21 community livestock workers in artificial insemination in four sub counties, procured for them liquid nitrogen tanks, semen bank, nitrogen field flask and field insemination kit. Established two sub county-level crop farmer demonstration sites, one
- demonstration site on six acres with demonstration site on six acres with improved livestock pastures in Lotome Sub-county, another site is under preparation in Nadunget sub-county. Procured 1,500kgs of beans, 131.75 Kgs of assorted treated vegetable seeds
- of tomatoes, cabbages, onions, kale and
- quayas, passion fruits and pawpaw in the fruit nurseries, and timber seeds eucalyptus, melia volcanancea, sena siame and Grivellia robusta in the tree nurseries. Developed Terms of Reference for
- consultancies of designs of three parish-level valley tanks and four village-level safe water ponds and initiated the procurement process for the contractor.
- Assessed community settlement patterns to inform the erection of 15 solar mini-grid systems. Identified three sites in Lomuno, Kalokengel and Lotome training center and commenced the procurement process.
- Conducted two capacity building sessions for 48 local construction artisans and masons in onsite manufacture of precast concrete slabs and one in construction of low-cost VIP latrines. The trainees have so far
- constructed 45 VIP latrines on their own. Ploughed 49 acres of land in four schools and 41 cropped with maize in the previous season, while farm tools
- were procured and distributed.
 Selected 34 girls and 16 boys for postprimary scholarships with 29 in Kotido
 SS, seven in St Paul, Mbale College, six in Teso College, Aloet and seven in Kangole Girls' SS, as well as procuring and distributing school uniforms, scholastic materials and sanitary wear. Facilitated the formation and
- registration of four Produce and Marketing Cooperatives as legal institutions (in Loroo, Lotome, Nadunget and Lorengedwat), three of which were provided with start-up capital.
