TREMENDOUS GROWTH OF KYAMBOGO UNIVERSITY Kyambogo University has 6 Faculties and 2 Schools with about 30, 000 students on Campus and about 34,000 students in affiliated institutions. The Faculties and Schools include:

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT IN THE UNIVERSITY

Government through the Higher Education Science and Technology (HEST) project have built a number of structures. These include: the Central Teaching Facility (CTF) which can seat about 3,500 students at the same time and this is a shared facility for teaching only. We have the multi-purpose science complex for laboratories for science education, we have the virtual library which is enhanced by ICT so that students can access books and journals without necessarily going to the library. We also have the Technical Teacher Education complex for skilling the youth in line with BTVET program of Uganda, we have new engineering laboratories and workshops and a new workshop for architecture and surveying. In addition to these new structures, all engineering laboratories, eight in total were renovated and are now equipped. In addition, the university council allocated funds for constructing the Central Lecture Block of four floors. Two are completed so far and there are two more floors to go. When completed, it will cost the university about sh16.6 billion and it will have a capacity of about 4,000 students.
