TERMS OF REFERENCE

CONSULTANCY TO DEVELOP ACTV STRATEGIC PLAN (2021 – 2025)

1. Background

African Centre for Treatment and Rehabilitation of Torture Victims (ACTV) is a Non-Governmental Organisation established in 1993 that advocates against torture and provides holistic treatment and rehabilitation to survivors of torture in Uganda and the Great Lakes Region. ACTV has been implementing her Strategic plan since 2016 which is due to end in December 2020. The organization has embarked on developing a new Strategic plan for the period 2021 – 2025 which will guide the organisation in contributing towards a world free of torture.

2. Objective of the Assignment

To develop a five year Strategic plan (2021-2025) that will guide ACTV in the fulfilment of her mandate to advocate against torture and provide holistic rehabilitation to survivors.

3. Scope of work

The scope of work for the Consultant will include but not be limited to:

- a) Review ACTV's vision and mission based on her mandate;
- b) Undertake stakeholder mapping and analysis;
- c) Undertake a situation analysis of ACTV operations to date;
- Through a consultative process and application of an appropriate tool of analysis, identify focus areas and develop strategic objectives and key result areas for the same;
- Review the institutional capacity, organizational set-up, financial and administrative systems against the ACTV mandate and the identified strategic objectives and key result areas; and make recommendations, if any;
- f) Propose a strategy for achieving the strategic objectives and key results;
- g) Develop a Results and Resources Framework for the plan period;
- Hold stakeholder meeting(s)to validate the draft Strategic Plan;
- i) Finalise Strategic plan and submit to ACTV.

4. Methodology

After an initial document review, the Consultant will develop a work plan to guide the assignment. The use of participatory processes to facilitate critical reflection by ACTV staff members and stakeholders is expected. As such, the Consultant will be expected to provide for active and meaningful engagement of ACTV staff members, Board members and other relevant stakeholders. The consultant is expected to provide the following deliverables:

- Work plan schedule clearly showing how the assignment will be carried out with clear timelines for conducting the evaluation of the strategic plan and for the development of the new strategic plan
- 2. Budget and appropriate assessment framework
- Inception Report clearly highlighting how the evaluation of the Strategic plan and development of the new Strategic plan will be conducted for discussion with ACTV Board and Management.
- New ACTV strategic plan document for the five year period; 2021 – 2025.
